



Psychology beats business training when it comes to entrepreneurship

Study shows:

- Monthly sales rose by 17% compared with the control group, while profits were up by 30%.
- Boosted innovation: recipients came up with more new products than the control group. That suggests that entrepreneurship, or at least some mental habits useful for it, can indeed be taught.
- More surprising was how poorly the conventional training performed: as far as the researchers could tell, it had no effect at all.
